News from the Library

A successful Scholastic Book Fair was held on January 29. As usual, community members were very supportive. In spite of the current economic challenges, total sales were within 10% of last year's sales. The library was able to keep books valued at \$340 and also earned over \$400 in cash to be used (as needed) for teams traveling to Oregon Battle of the Books regional and state tournaments.

Representing Adrian in the middle school Battle of the Books are Olivia Walker, Madi Purnell, Talia Esplin, Jill Nielson, and Quincy Pendergrass. Adrian's elementary team consists of Miriah Richardson, Kianna Scott, Gavin Scott, Kenny Purnell, Emily Case, and Mike Griffin. Their first challenge will be the regional battles to be held in LaGrande on March 21. The top two teams at each level at the regional battles will continue on to the Oregon Battle of the Books (OBOB) state contest to be held April 4 in Salem.

Nearly 200 new books are currently at some stage of being ordered or processed in the library. They include books from the book fair, sequels to OBOB books, award-winning titles from a backlist sale, and a large order of reference and nonfiction books which were specifically chosen to update our nonfiction sections. If you have any time you'd be willing to donate, we'd be glad to teach you how to cover new paperback books with Contac paper, cover new book jackets with Mylar, and clean and mend old books.

Sugar Cookies

CREAM: 1-Cup Sugar
1-Cup Powdered Sugar
1-Cup Margarine or butter
When creamed smooth, not gritty,
ADD: 2 eggs
1-teaspoon Vanilla
¾ Cup Salad Oil

SIFT and ADD: 1- teaspoon Soda
4 ½ Cups Flour

Spoon out onto an ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten each cookie gently with a glass dipped in sugar. Bake at 350* for about 10 minutes.

The K-8 Principal Report

We celebrated the 150th birthday for Oregon on February 12 (this was also Lincoln's 200th Birthday) by having students wear a costume depicting anything Oregon and teachers did something different in each classroom to commemorate the events. Oregon's birthday is on Saturday the 14th. The K-8 students enjoyed getting invited to the High School pep assembly and being allowed to be part of the activities. The High School leadership class selects some of our elementary students to be junior leaders in training. Our students continue to take the state tests in the new building's computer lab. It is so nice to have such up-to-date equipment to work with.

I read an article answering the question, "How can parents raise good readers?" It said that it is never too soon to start. Long before children actually "learn to read," they build reading skills. For example, talking and singing build verbal skills. And listening to books teaches about the written word. Some of the best ways to prepare for reading:

-Encourage your child to talk. Then listen to him/her. Ask questions that require more than a "yes" or "no" answer.

-Teach about books and printed materials. How to hold them, turn pages, and follow words from left to right.

-Use the alphabet. Sing the alphabet song. Point out letters. Have fun writing words, such as your child's name.

-Emphasize the sounds of language. Use nursery rhymes and songs. Let your child hear how words are made up of smaller parts and sounds.

-Read aloud to your child. Help him/her see the connection between printed words and the words you say.

As my wife and I have become grandparents I notice that my wife is doing what has been suggested and even gets me involved. I am sure most of you are already helping little guys become better readers. Thanks for all of your support.

He chose to focus his Senior Project on wildlife biology. For his physical project, he constructed a picture board of his job shadow experiences to showcase to the community. Hunter's research paper was about Chronic wasting disease, which is similar to mad cow disease, but affects deer, elk, and moose.

Senior Project helped Hunter in many areas. He learned to become independent because he had to learn without a teacher at the front of the classroom teaching him about his

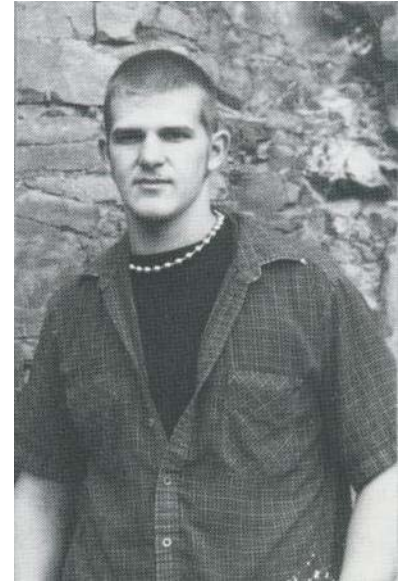
career choice. The research paper portion helped him gain experience in researching a specific topic, which would benefit him later in life.

Feb. Board Meeting, Tuesday the 10th.

Board Director Election May 19, 2009, there are three positions up for election. Each term is for four years, beginning July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2013. The terms up for election are: Zone 1, The area south of Mendiola Road to the south boundary of Lambert Dierking line or to the Ridgeview area. Zone 2, the area north of Mendiola Road to the Owyhee River, and Zone 3, the area north of the Owyhee River. To be eligible to be a candidate for election to a board position, you must be a register voter and have lived in the school district for one year immediately preceding the election. You must currently live in the Zone for which you file candidacy. You may not be an employee of the school district. To file for candidacy, you must file a declaration of candidacy with the Malheur County Clerk. The first day you can file your declaration of candidacy is February 7, 2009, and the last day to file is March 19, 2009. There are two forms that may be used to declare your candidacy, you may complete the candidacy declaration form and file the form with a \$10 fee, or a petition signed by 25 registered voters from district. The forms are available from the Darla Witty, at the school district office, or from the Malheur County Clerk's office at the County Courthouse in Vale.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes
January 13, 2008

The Board of Directors of Adrian School District #61, Malheur County, met on 13th day of January, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. in the Adrian School Library. Members present were: Paul Shenk, Neil Allison, Dave Reynolds, and Dennis Daugherty. Rick Olsen was absent. Others present were: Gene Mills, Superintendent/Clerk; Darla Witty, Deputy Clerk/Business Manager; Kevin Purnell, High School Principal; and Claudia Beltran, Student Body President.

- 1) Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Board Chairman, Neil Allison, at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2) Adopt Agenda The agenda was amended to move Information Item b) Standards Compliance Report to the February meeting and to go into executive session for a student matter. Motion was made by Dennis Daugherty and was seconded by Dave Reynolds, to adopt the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3) Architect Report/Construction Items Mr. Mills shared information he had received from Design West on estimated costs for future projects. The list included gym roof replacement, \$98,859.20 which is the cost that was included in the prior bid, remodel the high school science lab, \$160,000, demolition of the old building which includes a new wall for the remaining portion, \$177,000, and design costs of \$36,000. Mr. Mills asked the board which of the projects they would like to pursue. He suggested they consider the design/planning of a scaled down version of the science lab remodel so that the ground work would be in place should the federal economic stimulus plan include money for shovel ready projects, and the demo of the old building to finish up the new school project. The board was in agreement with this.
- 4) Student and Personnel Communications
 - a) Student Reports/Requests Claudia Beltran, Student Body President, presented the student body report as Katie Bowns had a schedule conflict. She reported that first semester finals were given the week before the break and the students played Bingo on the day school was out for Christmas Break. The students liked the long break. The Wrestling team is doing well, placing 5th at Joseph and at Imbler with Daniel Lode and James Prechtl placing first. Basketball is also doing well. Tip-off week is next week. The basketball teams will be home vs Crane on Saturday the 24th and the wrestlers will be at Crane that day. The Senior Citizen Luncheon is tentatively scheduled for March 7th. Drama is starting to organize and it looks like there will be a large cast again this year.
 - b) Staff Reports/Requests There were none.
 - c) Elementary Principal Report Mr. Ellsworth was unable to attend today, so Mr. Mills presented his report. The Winter Concerts were professionally done, the teachers participated in writing assessment training the last R/SD day in December, and Middle School boys basketball has started and their first game is January 21st at 4 p.m.

- d) High School Principal Report Mr. Purnell reported that new classes are being offered this semester, Personal Finance and English 12 to go with Senior Project. Mr. Mills is teaching Bigger, Faster, Stronger again and has added 9th grade P.E. as Miss Goss is working with English Language Learners and English as a Second Language students. Mr. Ready is doing Middle School P.E. There was an Academic Awards Assembly today. The teachers liked having the R/SD day the first day back from break. We are beginning to review the curriculum beginning with English and P.E./Health. National Honor Society is reactivating. There are twenty-two students meeting the initial application criteria who will be invited to submit membership applications. Mr. Purnell reported that he had been invited and spoke at the Nyssa Senior Center.
 - e) Superintendent Report There is a group organizing to formulate a facilities improvement program to try to get the State to provide funds for school facility improvement throughout the state. Obama's economic stimulus package has proposed about 36% of the local money to go to education. The alternative education issue has been settled and our share is 10 payments of \$1,630. The Malheur Education Service District Local Service Plan for 2009-2010 will be presented at the February meeting. Mr. Mills spoke with Mr. Gordon regarding the Sports Boosters donation of trees. Mr. Gordon will talk to Mrs. Ramirez.
 - f) Financial Report Darla Witty presented a balance sheet for all funds as of December 31, 2008, and a summary of general fund receipts and expenditures as of December 31, 2008. There will be approximately \$8,000.00 in change orders coming on the HVAC project which is basically completed. Mr. Poyzer is having us hold \$2,000 from the final payment until they can figure why there isn't any heat in the teacher's lounge area.
- 5) Public Comment There were none.
- 6) Consent Agenda Motion was made by Paul Shenk and was seconded by Dave Reynolds to adopt the December 11, 2008 minutes as presented and to approve the payment of the bills as listed in the amount of \$187,525.49. Motion carried unanimously.
- 7) Action Items
- a) Adopt Budget Calendar A budget calendar was proposed which calls for public comment to be received at the budget committee meeting. The calendar calls for the release of the budget to the public on April 30, 2009 and the budget committee will meet on May 5, 2009. Motion was made by Dave Reynolds and was seconded by Dennis Daugherty to adopt the budget calendar as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
 - b) Superintendent Evaluation Timeline and Process The superintendent's evaluation will be conducted in the same format as prior years at the February 10, 2009 meeting. Board members will complete the evaluation form, Policy CBG, and return it to Darla Witty by Tuesday, February 3rd. The staff will be asked for their input on the Superintendent Performance Rating form. The board consensus was not to do the board evaluation form this year.
- 8) Information Items
- a) School Board Member Election School Board Directors election will be May 19, 2009. There are three positions up for election; Zone 1, currently held by Dennis Daugherty, Zone 2, currently held by Rick Olsen and Zone 3, currently held by Dave

Reynolds. The first day you can file your declaration of candidacy is February 7, 2009, and the last day to file is March 19, 2009.

- b) Standards Compliance Report This report will be made in February.
- 9) Board Comments A board member commented that the gym was really hot at the Jordan Valley game. Mr. Mills explained that we are fine tuning our new heating/cooling system.
- 10) Executive Session Executive session as provided by ORS 192.660 for a student matter was entered at 8:05 p.m. Regular session resumed at 8:15 p.m.
- 11) Adjournment Motion was made by Dennis Daugherty and was seconded by Paul Shenk to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting was declared adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

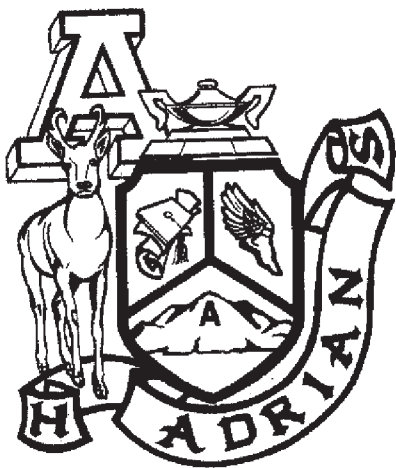
