High school volleyball and football play-offs are approaching.

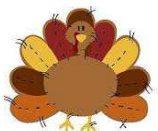
We are certain to have a home football play-off game on November 9th. Mark your calendars, then make every effort to come to the games. Our teams deserve strong community support.

Parents and students should also begin filling out the FAFSA worksheet. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Math 30 seconds

The first quarter P squared for P cubed award goes to Rada Ratirpong. This student was randomly chosen from students that were punctual to math or psychology class and submitted papers on time.

We have written about the importance of having a regular time and place to study math with a minimum amount of interference. Ideally students have enough information to successfully complete assignments but sometimes that is not the case. In this situation parents can help by having their student explain what they do understand about the problem and then asking the student for clarification or giving suggestions to the student for solving the problem. Often restating the problem clearly can lead to a solution or to a question that will lead to a solution. Once a difficult problem is solved the student hopefully can explain it to the parent. This procedure helps the student and may help the parent understand a little bit more about what the student is learning. On topic conversation and persistence are tools leading to success.

LIBRARY NEWS

Accelerated Reader

Do you have questions about whether a particular book is an "AR book"? Maybe you have books at home and would like to know whether AR quizzes are available for them. Maybe you are planning a Christmas gift of books and would like to make sure the books you choose are in your student's reading range. All those questions can be answered by looking at www.arbookfind.com.

Adrian schools now subscribe to the online version of Accelerated Reader so our students have access to all the AR quizzes that have been written. On the website www.arbookfind.com (AR Book Finder) you can enter the name of a book and learn what quizzes are available for the book. RP (reading practice) quizzes are the type of quiz used most often at Adrian although vocabulary and listening quizzes may also be used in some cases. AR Book Finder shows the reading level of the book, tells how many points it is worth, and gives a short description of the book. Ask your student whether his teacher expects him to be taking quizzes on books at a certain reading that she would especially like to read. (library-pg. 5)

Loving Life in Adrian—Anne Droste

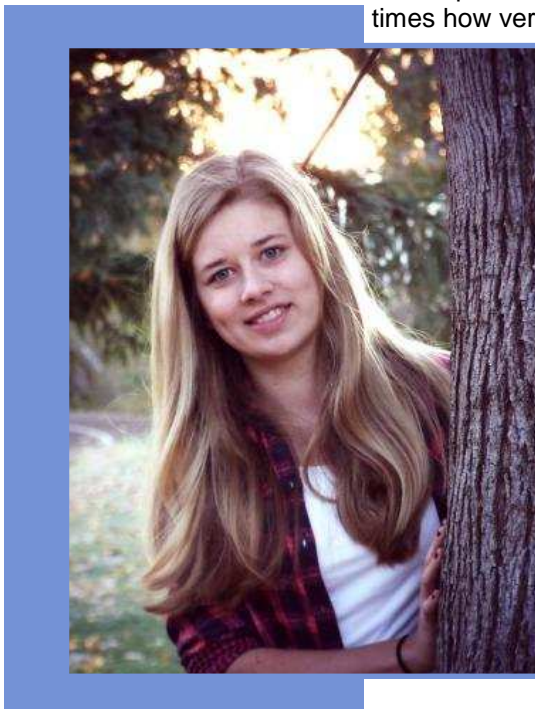

Elementary Principal Report Mr. Ellsworth reported that there were middle school games today in Notus, the football team and the volleyball B team lost while the volleyball A team won. The school year is moving along great. The PTO has discussed changing their Accelerated Reader incentive program. The kindergarten through eighth grade enrollment is about the same.

High School Principal Report Mr. Purnell reported that there are 74 students in the high school. There are 9 exchange students and 10 new students this year. Mr. Purnell thanked the board for helping greet the students the first day of school. Sheriff Brian Wolfe met with the school administrators regarding the sheriff department's desire to provide some school resource officer support. The National FFA trip arrangements are being finalized. The High School students are a great group of kids and the school year started smoothly. This week is Homecoming week. The Academic Year in America exchange student organization did not approve our dorm for this year. The students are living full time with their host families.

Superintendent Report Mr. Mills reported that the Governor is planning for a Special Legislative Session on September 30. Our enrollment is up 5 – 8 students. The PTO Back-to-School night went well. A plan is being developed which will provide some itinerant School Resource Officer time in the district. The Oregon School Board Association fall regional meeting will be held in Vale on September 24 at 6 p.m. Mr. Mills plans to attend and if any of the board members would like to attend they need to let Darla Witty know so an accurate meal count can be reported. Mr. Mills will be attending a BOLI (Bureau of Labor and Industries) seminar on Prevailing Wage in Baker on Sept. 17, 2013. Mr. Mills would like to attend a basketball clinic in Seattle, October 11-13. He would like to move the board meeting to the 8th of October as he will be traveling on the 10th. It was the consensus of the board to move the October board meeting to Tuesday the 8th. We are getting quotes for stadium lights for planning purposes.

Public Comment There were none.

Consent Agenda Motion was made and was seconded to adopt the minutes from the August 8, 2013 regular meeting and the August 22, 2013 special meeting as presented and to approve payment of the bills as listed in the amount of \$145,564.64. Motion carried unanimously.

Action Items

Extra-duty Contracts It was recommended that extra-duty contracts be offered to Stephanie Allison, Middle School Volleyball Assistant Coach; Gene Mills, Head Girls Basketball Coach; Kevin Purnell, Assistant Girls Basketball Coach; Aaron Mills, Head Boys Basketball Coach; Nolan Shira, Middle School Girls Basketball Coach and Middle School Boys Basketball Coach; and Julene Bowns, Testing Assistant. Motion was made and was seconded to offer extra-duty contracts as recommended. Motion carried unanimously.

Amend Teacher Contracts Motion was made and was seconded to amend the teaching contracts of Aimee Esplin, Joan Gordon, Kelsey Zimmerman, and Lorine VanCorbach to reflect movement on the salary schedule due to the completion of coursework. Motion carried unanimously.

Parent/School Compact Mr. Ellsworth presented a proposed copy of a Parent/School Compact to be used at parent-teacher conferences outlining basic commitments to learning for students, parents and teachers to discuss and agree to.
